<p>What's the difference between US scholar and open study/research?</p>	<p>Hello! Open study/research awards are part of the Student Program, not the Scholar Program. For more information, please see Fulbright Student Program.</p>
<p>Could you distinguish at some point the difference to be eligible between US scholar award (regular) and Distinguished US scholar. How to know which one to apply to? Thanks.</p>	<p>Hello! Distinguished Scholar Awards are viewed as the most prestigious appointments in the Fulbright Scholar Program. Awards are open to scholars who have more than seven years of experience in their discipline or area of expertise, though some awards may further restrict eligibility. All awards are open to academics and a limited number are also open to artists and professionals. Distinguished Scholars are expected to actively engage host institutions in the spirit of promoting mutual understanding and sharing knowledge. Awards may involve limited teaching, not to exceed more than one course per term, or three hours of teaching per week. Check award descriptions for institutional affiliation requirements and for year requirements. Distinguished Scholar Awards can be open to mid and senior academics. Please check the award description.</p>

A scholar can also be a professional, but most times professionals are their own categories of individuals that may not be affiliated in higher education or don't have a terminal degree.</p>
<p>What's a letter of invitation? And do we seek that from the org (if it's what I think it is)?</p>	<p>Hello! A letter invitation is provided to you from the host inviting you to do whatever activity you're doing. It depends on the award you're looking for if a letter of invitation is needed. <p>This may be silly to ask - but are there ever opportunities domestically? Like the American south for instance.</p>	<p>Hello! The Fulbright Scholar Program is strictly international for U.S. citizens to teach/research/do a professional project abroad. There are no opportunities in the U.S.</p>
<p>Will other countries in the Western Hemisphere/Arts and Humanities will be addressed? (Argentine, Chile, Perú)</p>	<p>Thank you for your inquiry! Certainly, there are many awards in the Western Hemisphere that may be of interest. Although not mentioned, I encourage you to check out those awards as they may be best for you and your project!</p>
<p>I am still not sure if Scholars in Arts and Hum (univ prof in these fields) are addressed here? Sorry for insisting—not sure if I am in the right webinar.</p>	<p>Thank you for your inquiry! For many awards featured, university faculty are welcome to apply -- in addition to professionals and artists which we are highlighting today! Simply, I encourage you to look at the award parameters to see if you can apply. As you may have teaching experience, I certainly encourage you to apply!</p>
<p>I am a Doctor of Business Administration (DBA) student, and a Licensed Nursing Home Administrator. I read that doctoral students are not eligible. But, I would like to be considered as an MBA graduate. Is this possible?</p>	<p>Hello! Doctoral students are eligible to apply to postdoctoral awards in the Fulbright U.S Scholar Program as long as your degree is completed by the start of your grant.</p>
